The City of Coral Springs is conducting a special election on June 18, 2019 to elect the City Commissioner, Seat 2. The active voter registration for Coral Springs as of May 20, 2019 is 81,578 voters. There are 34 precincts.

Covering Activity at Precincts: Do's and Do not's

Interviews:

The law allows press and other individuals to conduct interview activities within the 100-foot no-solicitation zone, but only after voters leave the polling place (building) and may not conduct interviews with voters waiting in line.

Please take extra steps to respect the privacy of voters. Provide press identification up front to avoid being confused with campaign workers.

Photography and video:

Photography is allowed outside of the polling room, but please keep in mind that it is the voters' decision whether they want to be photographed or not.

Voters may not use their camera at any time in the polling room to talk on the phone or to take photography or video. However, they may use their phone while voting to review their sample ballot.

The following polling place locations below have windows or doors which allow visibility into the polling room and will provide photo or videotaping opportunities for press outside of the polling place. You may take photographs or video tape outside of the polling place at these locations on Election Day:

Florida Law prohibits all photography inside Polling Places.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Where should press be on Election Day?

A: Press will be able to arrive at 5:30 a.m. on Election Day to the designated area at the Broward County Supervisor of Elections' Voting Equipment Center. Press may also want to set up between 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. at the Voting Equipment Center for the tabulating of votes.

Q: Which are the most populated polling places on election day?

Q: Where will the Supervisor of Elections be on Election Day?

A: The Supervisor of Elections will visit different precincts during the day and then will wait for the canvassing board to arrive at 7pm for the canvassing of votes at the Voting Equipment Center.

Q: How should press handle questions or concerns from voters?

A: It is important to our office that we can help you with questions. For information, please reach out to our media contact (see page 2 of this packet) and inform the office of any concerns. Be sure to include the voter's name and polling location associated so we may address them quickly and appropriately.

Q: What type of identification should voters present at the polling place?

A: Voters should bring photo identification that includes a signature. A Florida Driver's License or a Florida ID card is the quickest to process. Besides state-issued driver's licenses or ID cards, other accepted forms include:

- ✓ US passport
- ✓ Debit or credit cards with photos
- ✓ Military identification

- ✓ Student identification
- ✓ Retirement center ID
- ✓ Neighborhood association ID
- ✓ Public assistance identification
- ✓ Veteran health identification issued by the US Dept. of Veteran Affairs
- ✓ Concealed weapon or firearm issued pursuant to s. 790.06
- ✓ Employee identification issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the Federal Government, the state, a county, or a municipality.

If the photo ID does not contain the voter's signature, another piece of identification with a signature is required.

Q: Do media need to show credentials?

A: Yes, please have identification and credentials ready.
