PRIMARY ELECTION

August 18, 2020

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE

- Florida is a “closed primary” State meaning that only voters within a political party may vote in that party’s Primary Election. However, if all qualified candidates for an office have the same party affiliation and the winner will have no opposition in the General Election, there is a “Universal Primary Contest” in which all voters may vote. All Broward County voters have one or more Universal Primary Contests on their ballot and each is clearly marked “**Universal Primary Contest.**”
